Understanding the love God for yourself, is important. A thought may be, "yes, I know that 'God so loved the world,' but not me personally." Immediately, we know this is a rhetorical statement. Of course, God loves each of us personally. But, even when we know it, it is often difficult to understand it. Why is that?

Who knows you better than anyone? Each one is their own worst critic. We know every flaw, every evil act, every bad thought we have ever had! But, you don't hate yourself for it. Usually, we seek a way to improve and do better the next time. We don't give up.

Failure is evidence that you made an effort and tried to improve. An old saying that is credited to Thomas Edison on failing to be successful in making a light bulb is: "I have not failed 1,000 times, I have discovered 1,000 ways it will not work." You tried, now try again. Do not quit!

Set high goals for yourself, but do not be unreasonable in your expectations. Focus on goals that will be beneficial to the Lord's kingdom and those closest to you.

Why not set a goal for yourself right now? In fact, let's make it two goals, one for Jesus and one for yourself. Just for today, what can you do for Jesus and what can you do for you? They do not have to be super big, just something you can do before you go to sleep.

On occasion we think God does not love us because we don't love ourselves. We have expectations beyond our ability and feel we are failures because we failed to be the superstar in our narrative. God still loves you. God loves you, even if you never reach the super success you want.

Goals need to be expanded as we progress in life. For instance, education is not about completing the next grade, it is about learning. At what point do we know all the Bible we need to know? Progression in life is about moving forward.

God rejoices in your personal progression as a spiritual person. You and He may want to see your advances happen more quickly, but he loves every baby step you take.

THE IMITATION OF CHRIST Contempt of Worldly Vanities


Marriage advice across the ages
