Sunday Morning Sermon Speaker - Charles Clodfelter

Sermon: Tell Me About Jesus Scripture: Acts 8:34-35,17:18

Doctrinal Issue 1

Why are there so many denominations? It is safe to say that most were created with good intentions. Good intentions are not sufficient. Man's changes may seem wise or best, but do they harmonize or agree with scripture. No earthly organization is talked about in the New Testament except the local congregation. Even if there are some Positives in a national or world wide organization, there are Negatives also. There are thousands of denominations, some of which are simply a preacher or a congregation that are still basically the same as before, but they wanted to be free from the control of their denomination. So they basically became a denomination of one congregation. At a minimum, there at least 22 different Baptist denominations, 80 Methodist, 242 Catholic.

Some denominations were looked on in a somewhat negative view by the community, so they dropped their denominational name, often call themselves nondenominational and now have some of the largest congregations in the nation.

Others, recognized the younger generation was not impressed by what they perceived as bickering by the denominations, so congregations dropped the name of their denomination from their name.

It has never been the intention of churches of Christ to be a denomination. Denomination in meaning is to be a part of the whole. Our plea is to return to the true teaching of the New Testament and be just what Jesus wants us to be. The goal of unity is based on getting back to the Bible.

There was a story published in a magazine, several years ago, on why a woman did not share her recipes, that went like this. Mae was an excellent cook, but would never share her recipes. She had one friend who would not stop pestering her about a particular recipe. Finally, she broke down because of the continued pleading and imploring, "if you were really my friend."

At the next social event, the woman proudly presented her dish, but instead of fresh scrimp and lobster, she used canned tuna and salmon. Also, she substituted margarine for butter, used half and half rather than whole cream and as she sat the dish on the table, she stated: "if you don't like it, blame Mae, its her recipe."

Let's be honest, those who create denominations are generally of the opinion that they are getting closer to what God wants the church to be. While giving them the benefit of the doubt on motivation, the comparison of doctrine must be with the New Testament. Let us Get Back to the Bible in doctrine.

Loving my "enemies"

In polarized times, when people view huge concepts such as justice, government policy and care for neighbors differently, how do we follow Jesus' command to love our enemies? I prefer the word *opponents*, but our Lord's instructions still stand.

In the Bible, "love" doesn't mean liking someone; it means caring for them, treating them kindly. I find *The Message* paraphrase of Luke 6:27-36 helpful: "Let them bring out the best in you, not the worst," Jesus says about one's enemies. So, when I contact government leaders to express my opinions, I address them with respect, whether I agree with them or not. When I encounter a neighbor whose views oppose mine, I ask myself what I would want them to do for me, whether help with an errand or be friendly. Then, as The Message puts it, I "grab the initiative and do it for *them*."

And this, which might be the hardest: Amid tough times, Jesus says, "Respond with the supple moves of prayer." It's human nature to pray that God change our enemies' or opponents' minds. But it's more Christlike to pray for their health, their families and whatever *God* desires for them, not what *I* want. Can I do this? With God's help, yes.
