Sermon: Onward and Upward

Scripture: Heb 6:1

PUBLIC PRAYER

Public speaking is terrifying to many people. In fact it is said to be the number one fear, ahead of dying. When you add prayer to that it becomes more fearful. Prayer is a part of our worship, so thanks to all the men who are willing to lead prayer during the time we assemble together for worship. Thank you.

This note is not intended as a criticism of any who are leading us in worship through prayer. Rather it is hoped to be an encouragement for others who may be hesitant to lead prayer publicly.

Once a recent convert was asked if he would lead a prayer for an evening service. He replied, "Oh, no, I haven't memorized all the phrases yet." My response was, you don't memorize words, you talk to God."

In my youth, written prayers were frowned upon. Mostly because of the religious groups who had printed prayers in hymnals and other books that they just turned to and read. The idea being that if a brother

used notes to pray, it was not "from the heart."

While appreciating the idea of praying from the heart, we do not denigrate our hymns which are in the songbooks. Nor do we say the preacher is not sincere if he uses notes when he preaches. So, notes are okay.

Preparation for public prayer is a good idea. It is a good idea to have two or three starter thoughts in your wallet for the occasions when you are unexpectedly asked to lead a public prayer. Turn to the book of Psalms and read the first couple of verses in several psalms to see how they begin. Find three that would be suitable to begin a prayer, copy them and tuck in your wallet.

Think about the things that are important for which you would want to ask God's help or to thank Him, make notes for them, so you don't forget. Don't fall in the habit of rote prayer, but you can prepare ahead.
