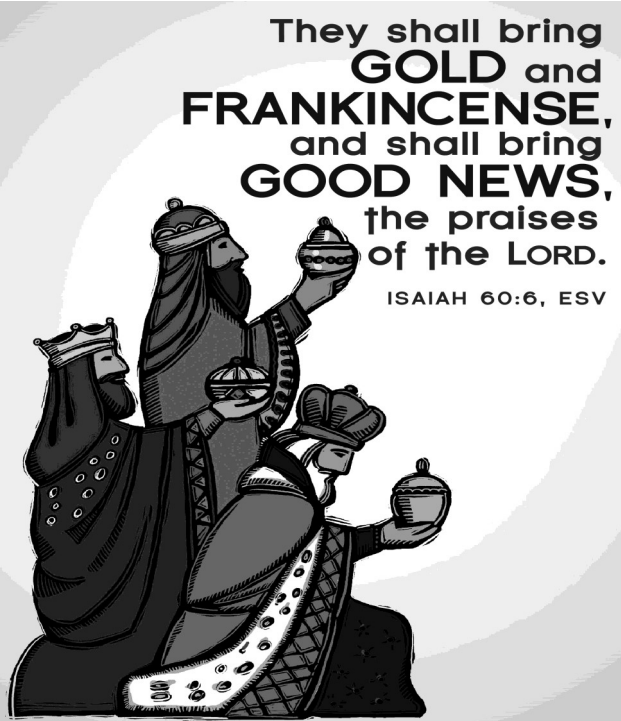

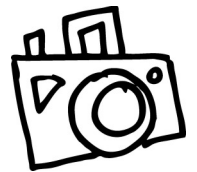

Sermon: A Savior is Born

Scripture: Matt 1:18-25

For his Christmas album *Milk & Cookies*, worship leader David Crowder wanted to focus on the relationship aspect of the holidays and the mixed emotions involved. Deaths of loved ones, absence from home or having “no home to get back to,” he says, can wrap sadness into what’s supposed to be a joyful season.

Yet pain and separation perfectly mirror the meaning of Christmas, according to Crowder. “It’s about the created being at a distance from their Maker and ... God making a way back into communion with [them].” He adds, “I feel like most of the stuff that we experience around the season points to what is the miraculous — that there was the best gift ever given, and it was to make a way back into relationship with our Creator.”
